Deliverables

1. Pre-design conference with client

3. List of required permits to be obtained by the client

5. Written plans and specifications (including sketches and drawings) shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to install the practice. Use Form(s) KS-ECS-4, Grass Seeding, and/or KS-ECS-5, Tree/Shrub Planting, to record planned practice design.
6. Certification that the design meets practice standard and specification criteria will be documented on Form(s) KS-ECS-4 and/or KS-ECS-5.
7. Certification that the client has reviewed the design and agrees to carry out the practice as planned will be documented on Form(s) KS-ECS-4 and/or KS-ECS-5.
8. Compliance with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws and regulations and NRCS policies during design will be documented on the Form KS-CPA-52, Environmental Effects for Conservation Planning.
9. Operation and maintenance plan
10. Progress reporting
11. If enrolled in a conservation program, this practice must meet all conditions and requirements of program enrollment that may exceed the practice standard.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables

1. Pre-application conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Staking and layout according to plans and specifications including applicable layout notes
4. Application guidance as needed
5. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer during application as required
6. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws and regulations and NRCS policies during application
