DESIGN

Deliverables

1. Pre-design conference with client
2. Planned practice as identified in the conservation plan will address the identified resource concern
3. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
4. Practice standard criteria-related computations and analyses to develop plans, specifications, and operation and maintenance plan including, but not limited to, results of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) current erosion prediction tools and other assessments to address targeted criteria, planned residue amount, orientation, and distribution of residue and timing of soil disturbance
5. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and complies with applicable laws and regulations using Form KS-CPA-52, Environmental Effects for Conservation Planning
6. Design modifications during application as required
7. Written plans and specifications (including sketches and drawings) shall be provided to the client that adequately describe the requirements to install the practice and obtain necessary permits (use Form KS-ECS-344, Residue Management - Seasonal - 344).
8. Certification that the client has reviewed the design and agrees to carry out the practice as planned will be documented on Form KS-ECS-344.
9. Progress reporting
10. If enrolled in a conservation program, this practice must meet all conditions and requirements of program enrollment that may exceed the practice standard.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables

1. Pre-application conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Application guidance as needed
4. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer
5. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws and regulations and NRCS policies during installation
6. Certification that the application process meets design and permit requirements

CHECKOUT

Deliverables

1. Records of application
 - a. Extent of practice units applied
 - b. Actual amount of residue present during critical period to meet targeted standard criteria
2. Certification that the application meets NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits
3. Progress reporting
