

STATEMENT OF WORK

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These deliverables apply to this individual practice. For other planned practice deliverables, refer to those specific statements of work.

DESIGN

Deliverables

1. Pre-design conference with client.
2. Design documentation that will demonstrate that the criteria in the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) practice standard has been met and is compatible with planned and applied practices
 - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan
 - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
 - c. List all required and/or facilitating practices
 - d. Practice standard criteria-related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to the following:
 - i. Number and width of trap strips
 - ii. Location of trap strips
 - iii. Vegetative cover
 - iv. Width of cropped strip
 - v. Orientation of trap strips in relation to direction of erosive winds
3. Written plans and specifications (including sketches and drawings) shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to install the practice and obtain necessary permits. Plans and specifications shall be developed in accordance with the requirements of Conservation Practice Standard 589c, Cross Wind Trap Strips.
4. Operation and maintenance plan
5. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and complies with applicable laws and regulations will be documented on Form KS-ECS-589C.
6. Design modifications during installation as required
7. If enrolled in a conservation program, this practice must meet all conditions and requirements of program enrollment that may exceed the practice standard.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables

1. Pre-installation conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Staking and layout according to plans and specifications including applicable layout notes
4. Installation guidance as needed
5. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer
6. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations, and NRCS policies during installation
7. Certification that the installation process and materials meet design and permit requirements

CHECKOUT

Deliverables

1. Records of installation
 - a. Extent of practice units applied
 - b. Actual materials used

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2. Certification that the installation meets NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits will be documented on Form KS-ECS-589c.
3. Progress reporting
