## **DESIGN**

---

### **Deliverables:**

1. Design documentation that will demonstrate that the criteria in Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) practice standard has been met and is compatible with planned and applied practices.
  - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan.
  - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
  - c. List all required and/or facilitating practices
  - d. Practice standard criteria-related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to the following:
    - i. Kind, size and number of livestock
    - ii. Diet recommendations
    - iii. Feed analysis
    - iv. Manure analysis
2. Written plans and specifications (including sketches and drawings) shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to apply the practice and obtain necessary permits. N/A
3. Specification sheet provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to apply the practice and obtain necessary permits.
4. Operation and maintenance plan
5. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and comply with applicable laws and regulations
6. Design modifications during application as required
7. If enrolled in a conservation program, this practice must meet all conditions and requirements of program enrollment that may exceed the practice standard.

## **INSTALLATION**

---

### **Deliverables**

1. Pre-application conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Application guidance as needed
4. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer
5. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations and NRCS policies during application.
6. Certification that the application process and materials meets design and permit requirements
