

STAFFORD COUNTY - DESIGNATED CRITICAL HABITATS

ARKANSAS DARTER - *Etheostoma cragini* (Gilbert, 1885)

Status: Threatened in Kansas
Federal Candidate

The main stem of Rattlesnake Creek beginning in the SE/4 28-T25S-R15W through 2-T23S-R13W.

BALD EAGLE - *Haliaeetus leucocephalus* (Linnaeus, 1766)

Status: Threatened in Kansas
Threatened Nationally

LEAST TERN - *Sterna antillarum* (Lesson, 1847)

Status: Endangered in Kansas
Endangered Nationally

SNOWY PLOVER - *Charadrius alexandrinus* (Linnaeus, 1758)

Status: Threatened in Kansas

WHITE-FACED IBIS - *Plegadis chihi* (Vieillot, 1817)

Status: Threatened in Kansas

WHOOPING CRANE - *Grus americana* (Linnaeus, 1758)

Status: Endangered in Kansas
Endangered Nationally

Currently, the following areas are designated critical to the bald eagle, least tern, snowy plover, white-faced ibis and whooping crane:

All lands and waters within Quivira National Wildlife Refuge in Stafford, Reno, and Rice counties.
