

eFOTG – Michigan Soil Information

Soil information available from this eFOTG site is the current OFFICIAL soil information for Michigan. Soil information obtained from other sources may not be current and should be checked against the official information from this eFOTG site.

Much of the soil information available from the eFOTG is provided through a link to the Soil Data Mart: <http://soildatamart.nrcs.usda.gov>

To view or download data and reports for a specific county, click on the county name under “Soil Information” on the menu on the left side of the eFOTG page.

“Soil Reports” and “Soil Data Download” options are provided for all Michigan counties:

Soil Reports: Links to the Soil Data Mart, where reports can be viewed on-screen and printed.

Soil Data Download: Links to the Soil Data Mart, where tabular data, an Access template, and spatial data for GIS use can be downloaded.

Soil mapping or digitizing for all Michigan counties is available on the Web Soil Survey at: <http://websoilsurvey.nrcs.usda.gov/app>. However, nineteen cities in the southeast part of Wayne County, Michigan are not currently mapped and posted on the Web Soil Survey. The cities of Flint, Michigan and Muskegon, Michigan are soil mapped but are also not posted. Web Soil Survey data is official data, as it is also derived from a link to the Soil Data Mart.
