Option A – requires that grazing occur at no more than 75% of the stocking rate determined by NRCS.  
Option B – requires that at least 25% of the acres of each field or contiguous fields not be grazed.

**General Requirements**

- Only acres enrolled into **CP-1, CP-2, CP-4B/D, CP-10, CP-18B/C, and CP-38E** are eligible.
- Approval has been provided for **GRAZING ONLY** on **CP-25** acreage established to **prairie/grassland** habitat.
- Areas within 120 feet of a stream or other permanent waterbody are ineligible for emergency haying/grazing.
- Use of Emergency Haying/Grazing in 2012 may preclude use of Managed Haying/Grazing in future years.

**HAYING:** Proposed Date of Haying - \_\_\_\_\_ (**Attach a map of acres to be hayed.**)

- The minimum stubble height is 4" and at least 50% of each field (or contiguous fields) must remain unhayed.
- Haying may not be initiated prior to July 16<sup>th</sup> and only one cutting is permitted. Hayed acres cannot be grazed.
- All haying must be completed by August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2012 with bales/stacks removed by October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

**GRAZING:** Approximate Date to be Initiated - \_\_\_\_\_

- Grazing may not be initiated prior to July 16<sup>th</sup> and cannot occur on any acres used for Emergency Haying.
- Once minimum-grazing height of key forage species is reached, livestock will be removed.
- **ALL LIVESTOCK SHALL BE REMOVED FROM CRP FIELDS BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30<sup>th</sup>, 2012.**
- If adequate re-growth occurs (see table below), grazing may be reinitiated provided that livestock are removed once the minimum grazing height is reached and/or before September 30<sup>th</sup>.
