3. Equipment Checklist:

Burn kit: drip torch, fire weather kit, two-way radios, first aid kits, gasoline-diesel, drinking water, flags for highway flaggers, etc.

Fire suppression: pumper truck, tractor/maintainer, fusees, backpack sprayers, livestock sprayer, rakes, shovels, etc.

4. Pre-burn Checklist:

a. Protection considered includes livestock, feeders, pens & buildings, utility poles, oil & gas, fences, hunting facilities, desirable wooded areas, windmills & storage facilities, special wildlife habitat areas, haystacks, equipment, liability protection, etc.

b. Water source for refilling pumpers: where water is available, if from ponds a transfer pump is on-site, etc.

7. Predicted weather conditions from the National Weather Service, immediately before burn. For Teton, Lincoln, Uinta, Sublette, and the west part of Sweetwater, call 208-334-9862. All other counties call 307-638-6437.
