

COWLEY COUNTY - DESIGNATED CRITICAL HABITATS

ARKANSAS DARTER - *Etheostoma cragini* (Gilbert, 1885)

Status: Threatened in Kansas
Federal Candidate

Currently, the following areas are designated critical for the Arkansas darter:

- (1) Spring Creek and its tributaries from its point of entry at the Sumner/Cowley border (Sec. 18-T34S-R3E) to its confluence with the Arkansas River (Sec. 22-T34S-R3E).

BALD EAGLE - *Haliaeetus leucocephalus* (Linnaeus, 1766)

Status: Threatened in Kansas
Threatened Nationally

Currently, the following areas are designated critical for Bald Eagles:

- (1) All lands and waters within a corridor along the main stem of the Arkansas River to the Kansas/Oklahoma border (Sec. 18-T35S-R5E). All listed stream corridors have outermost boundaries that are along a line 100 yards landward from the stream's ordinary high water mark on each bank.

ARKANSAS RIVER SHINER - *Notropis girardi* (Hubbs and Ortenburger, 1929)

Status: Endangered in Kansas
Threatened Nationally

SPECKLED CHUB - *Macrhybopsis aestivalis tetranemus* (Girard, 1856)

Status: Endangered in Kansas

Currently, the following areas are designated critical for the Arkansas River shiner and speckled chub:

All reaches of the main stem Arkansas River to the Kansas/Oklahoma border (Sec. 18-T35S-R5E).
