ARKANSAS DARTER - *Etheostoma cragini* (Gilbert, 1885)

Status: Threatened in Kansas

STRECKER'S CHORUS FROG - *Pseudacris streckeri streckeri* (Wright and Wright, 1923)

Status: Threatened in Kansas

Due to the intermittency of the individual breeding pools used by Strecker's Chorus Frogs, specific site designations for critical habitats are not made; however, whenever and wherever they occur, all wetlands and rainwater basins and pools within an area lying east of the Barber/Harper County line and located south of U.S. Highway 160, east of U.S. Highway 281, and west of a north-south line beginning at the NE corner (Sec. 26-T32S-R7W), and extending due south to the Kansas-Oklahoma border.
