

## Herbaceous Weed Control (315)

*Initial setting: Existing range, forest, pasture, hay, or wildlife land where reduction or removal of herbaceous weeds, including invasive, noxious and prohibited plants, is desired to meet a management objective*



1. Eradication or control of target herbaceous weeds using chemical, biological, and/or mechanical methods using Integrated Pest Management principles

These effects are subjective and somewhat dependent on variables such as climate, terrain, soil, etc. All appropriate local, State, Tribal, and Federal permits and approvals are the responsibility of the landowners and are presumed to have been obtained. All income changes are partially dependent upon market fluctuations which are independent of the conservation practices. Users are cautioned that these effects are estimates that may or may not apply to a specific site.
