Definition

Applying plant residues, by-products, or other suitable materials not produced on the site to the soil surface.



Purpose (Check all Planned Purposes)

- Conserve moisture
- Prevent surface compaction or crusting
- Reduce runoff and erosion
- Control weeds
- Moderate soil temperature
- Help establish plant cover

Where Used

On soils subject to erosion, on critical areas, on soils that have a low infiltration rate, where needed for control of weeds, and where needed to establish seedlings, trees and shrubs.

Careful consideration must be given to the site conditions (soils, slope, drainage, etc.) and the purpose of the mulch to select the appropriate type of mulch, rate of mulch application, and anchoring needed. Follow the enclosed site-specific requirements.
