DESIGN

Deliverables:

1. Design documents that demonstrate criteria in NRCS practice standard have been met and are compatible with planned and applied practices
 - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan.
 - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
 - c. Compliance with NRCS national and state utility safety policy (NEM part 503-Safety, Section 503.00 through 503.22)
 - d. List all required and/or facilitating practices List all required and/or facilitating practices
 - e. Practice standard criteria-related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to:
 - i. Timing and sequence
 - ii. Consideration of soil erosion potential
 - iii. Vegetation establishment
2. Written plans and specifications including sketches and drawings shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to install the practice and obtain necessary permits.
3. Identify fields where practice to be applied on a farm or ranch plan map.
4. Operation and maintenance plan.
5. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and comply with applicable laws and regulations, Brush Management Chemical Control Design Worksheet WY-ECS-21 and Pest Management Environmental Risk Assessment WY-ECS-46.
6. Design modifications during installation as required.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables

1. Pre-installation conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Staking and layout according to plans and specifications including applicable layout notes
4. Installation guidance as needed
5. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer
6. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations and NRCS policies during installation
7. Certification that the installation process and materials meets design and permit requirements, Brush Management Chemical Control Design Worksheet WY-ECS-21 and Pest Management Environmental Risk Assessment WY-ECS-46.

 - a. Extent of practice units applied
 - b. Actual materials used
2. Certification that the application meets NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits, Brush Management Chemical Control Design Worksheet WY-ECS-21 and Pest Management Environmental Risk Assessment WY-ECS-46.

4. Exit conference with client and contractor.
