## **California NRCS Practice Standards**

### **Introduction:**

California NRCS Conservation Practice Standards are available as "Acrobat® PDF" files and may not be modified for local use. Specifications and Performance Requirements are available as Microsoft® Word files and may be modified to meet local conditions. If the Word file opens in "normal view", the format may not correctly show columns. If this happens, at the Word Toolbar, choose "View" and select "Page Layout". The National NRCS Conservation Practice Standards and Practice Effects may be downloaded from the National Handbook of Conservation Practices website. By policy, the Practice Standards may be downloaded, but not modified.
