Definition

The removal or control of herbaceous weeds including invasive, noxious and prohibited plants.

Purpose

This practice is commonly used for one or more of the following purposes:

1. Enhance accessibility, quantity, and quality of forage and/or browse.
2. Restore or release native or create desired plant communities and wildlife habitats consistent with the ecological site.
3. Protect soils and control erosion
4. Reduce fine-fuels fire hazard and improve air quality

Where Used

On all lands except active cropland where the removal, reduction, or manipulation of herbaceous vegetation is desired.

Resource Management System

A Resource Management system is a combination of conservation practices and resource management, for the treatment of all identified resource concerns for soil, water, air,

plants, and animals, within a conservation management or planning unit that meets or exceeds the quality criteria in the Field Office Technical Guide for resource sustainability. Forage Harvest Management is applied as part of Conservation Management Systems for crop, hay, and pasture lands. Herbaceous Weed Control is often planned as part of Forage Harvest Management (511), Nutrient Management (590), Brush Management (314), Forage and Biomass Planting (512), Prescribed Grazing (528), Prescribed Burning (338) and Upland Wildlife Management (645),

Criteria, Considerations, and Specifications

The Criteria, Considerations, and Specifications for this practice shall be in concurrence with CT Field Office Technical Guide and the CT Conservation Practice Standard for this practice.

Certification


