## **DESIGN**

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### **Deliverables:**

1. Design documents that demonstrate criteria in Florida NRCS practice standard have been met and are compatible with planned and applied practices
  - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan.
  - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
  - c. List all required and/or facilitating practices
  - d. Practice standard criteria-related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to:
    - i. Aquatic species and stocking rates
    - ii. Water source and suitability
    - iii. Feed requirements as applicable
2. Written plans and specifications including sketches and drawings shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to apply the practice and obtain necessary permits.
3. Operation and maintenance plan
4. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and comply with applicable laws and regulations
5. Design modifications during application as required

## **INSTALLATION**

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### **Deliverables**

1. Pre-application conference with client
2. Verification that client has obtained required permits
3. Application guidance as needed
4. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer
5. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations and NRCS policies during application
6. Certification that the application process and materials meets design and permit requirements

## **CHECK OUT**

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### **Deliverables / Practice Certification and Check-out Requirements**

1. Records of application for certification:
  - a. Stocking
    - i. kind
    - ii. size
    - iii. number
    - iv. date
  - b. Corrective management applied to control fish population
  - c. Actions taken to control water quality
2. Certification that the application meets Florida NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits
3. Progress reporting
