



THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES
KNOWN OR LIKELY TO OCCUR
IN
GRANT COUNTY, KANSAS

Arkansas River Shiner (*Notropis girardi*) - Endangered: Known to occur historically and likely still occurs during high flow events in the main stem Cimarron River. *Critical habitat has been designated.* Threatened nationally.

Bald Eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) - Threatened: Known to occur as an occasional winter visitant. Threatened nationally.

Eastern Spotted Skunk (*Spilogale putorius interrupta*) - Threatened: May occur in suitable habitat. Prefers brushy grasslands along streams. May also be found in abandoned or little used farm buildings.

Flathead Chub (*Platygobio gracilis*) - Threatened: May occur during high flow events in the main stem Cimarron River.

Least Tern (*Sterna antillarum*) - Endangered: May occur as an occasional seasonal transient or summer visitant. Endangered nationally.

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*) - Endangered: May occur as an uncommon winter visitant.

Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*) - Threatened: May occur as a rare seasonal transient near ponds and streams. Threatened nationally.

Snowy Plover (*Charadrius alexandrinus*) - Threatened: May occur as an occasional seasonal transient and summer visitant near water bodies.

Texas Longnose Snake (*Rhinocheilus lecontei tessellatus*) - Threatened: May occur in open prairies with sandy soils and/or rocky canyons.

White-faced Ibis (*Plegadis chihi*) - Threatened: May occur as an occasional seasonal transient or summer visitant at wetlands and impoundments.
