



**THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES
KNOWN OR LIKELY TO OCCUR
IN
REPUBLIC COUNTY, KANSAS**

Bald Eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) - Threatened: Known to occur as a regular winter resident near the Republican River and at wetlands at Jamestown Wildlife Area. Critical habitat has been designated. *Critical habitat has been designated.* Threatened nationally.

Eastern Spotted Skunk (*Spilogale putorius interrupta*) - Threatened: May occur along woodland edges, brushy rocky grasslands, and abandoned farmsteads.

Eskimo Curlew (*Numenius borealis*) - Endangered: Formerly a regular spring transient. Uses overgrazed grasslands and bare fields. Has not been recorded in Kansas since 1902. It may still occur as a rare transient. Endangered nationally.

Least Tern (*Sterna antillarum*) - Endangered: Known to occur as an occasional seasonal transient or summer visitant at wetlands and along the Republican River. Endangered nationally.

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*) - Endangered: May occur as an occasional winter visitant at wetlands and impoundments where waterfowl or other birds concentrate.

Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*) - Threatened: Known to occur rarely as a seasonal transient at wetlands, river sandbars, or sparsely vegetated shorelines of impoundments. Threatened nationally.

Snowy Plover (*Charadrius alexandrinus*) - Threatened: Known to occur as an occasional seasonal transient or summer visitant at sparsely vegetated wetlands, river banks, or impoundment shorelines.

White-faced Ibis (*Plegadis chihi*) - Threatened: Known to occur as a seasonal transient and occasional summer visitant at wetlands and impoundments.

Whooping Crane (*Grus americana*) - Endangered: May occur as an occasional seasonal transient at wetlands. May also rest on fields and meadows away from human disturbance. Endangered nationally.
