



**THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES
KNOWN OR LIKELY TO OCCUR
IN
STEVENS COUNTY, KANSAS**

Arkansas River Shiner (*Notropis giraridi*) - Endangered: May occur occasionally in the Cimarron River main stem during flood flows. *Critical habitat has been designated.* Threatened nationally.

Bald Eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) - Threatened: Known to occur as an occasional winter visitant or resident. Threatened nationally.

Checkered Garter Snake (*Thamnophis marcianus marcianus*) - Threatened: May occur near springs or ponds.

Eastern Spotted Skunk (*Spilogale putorius interrupta*) - Threatened: May occur in wooded riparian corridor along Cimarron River or around abandoned farmsteads.

Flathead Chub (*Platygobio gracilis*) - Threatened: May occur occasionally in Cimarron River during flood flows.

Least Tern (*Sterna antillarum*) - Endangered: May occur as an occasional summer resident or visitant along Cimarron River. Endangered nationally.

New Mexico Blind Snake (*Leptotyphlops dulcis dissectus*) - Threatened: May occur in moist sandy areas.

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*) - Endangered: May occur as an uncommon transient or winter visitant in areas where concentrations of waterfowl or other birdlife provide ample prey.

Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*) - Threatened: May occur as a rare transient. Prefers sparsely vegetated shorelines of streams and impoundments. Threatened nationally.

Snowy Plover (*Charadrius alexandrinus*) - Threatened: May occur as an occasional seasonal visitant or summer resident. No nesting records.

Texas Longnose Snake (*Rhinocheilus lecontei tessellatus*) - Threatened: May occur in sandy rangelands.

White-faced Ibis (*Plegadis chihi*) - Threatened: Known to occur occasionally as a seasonal visitant at impoundments, streams, and wetlands.
