MISSOURI TECHNICAL GUIDE TRANSMITTAL NO. 419

The following Missouri Statements of Work (SOW) have been posted on the Missouri eFOTG.

*Residue and Tillage Management, Seasonal (344) SOW*  
*Residue and Tillage Management, Mulch Till (345) SOW*  
*Residue and Tillage Management, Ridge Till (346) SOW*  
*Residue and Tillage Management, No Till/Strip Till/Direct Seed (329) SOW*

*Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan SOW*

The revised practice SOWs are located in Section IV, under the related Conservation Practice. Field offices should use these SOWs for guidance on practice design, installation and documentation.

The Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan Statement of Work is a new SOW and is located in Section IV, under Non-Practice Statements of Work. A comprehensive nutrient management plan (CNMP) SOW describes and documents a conservation system within a conservation plan that is unique to animal feeding operations. A CNMP is comprised of six elements: (a) manure and wastewater handling and storage, (b) land treatment practices, (c) nutrient management, (d) record keeping, (e) feed management, and (f) other utilization activities. At a minimum, a CNMP must address quality criteria to the sustainable level for soil erosion and water quality for the planning unit associated with the animal feeding operation. This CNMP Statement of Work specifies deliverables that apply to CNMP planning. When specific conservation practices are utilized, refer to the appropriate Statements of Work.
