The following Missouri Conservation Practice Job Sheets have been posted on the Missouri FOTG:

- *Native Pollinators (JS-BIOL-34)*
- *Quail Covey Headquarters-Establishment from Seed (JS-BIOL-35)*

The Native Pollinator Job Sheet summarizes guidance on providing habitat for native pollinators through the management of cropland, grassland, and woodland land types. Information includes seeding requirements, native forb/wildflowers and tree/shrub species recommendations, and suggested management techniques. A list of native forbs, tame legumes, and woody plants with their associated blooming periods is also included. This information should be used for guidance in selecting seeding mixtures and land management techniques that will provide essential food and cover for native pollinating insects. This job sheet supports the Upland Wildlife Habitat Management (645) conservation standard.

The Quail Covey Headquarters – Establishment from Seed Job Sheet summarizes guidance on the establishment and management of covey headquarters developed from seed. Information and guidance regarding site preparation, recommended shrub species, seeding rates, and maintenance is included. Covey headquarters, or clumps of dense shrubby cover, provide important protective cover for many wildlife species. This job sheet supports the Upland Wildlife Habitat Management (645) conservation standard.
