The CRC is designated by the State Conservationist to carry out day to day implementation of NRCS cultural resources policy and procedures, and overall compliance and program activities in NRCS operations. In Nebraska this person is also the Cultural Resources Specialist. The CRC is the liaison with the State Historic Preservation Officer, national Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, and Tribal governments in matters of policy and procedure relating to cultural resources.

Designated by each District Conservationist the FOCRC is the liaison responsible for implementing Nebraska cultural resources policy and procedure at the level of field office operations within Natural Resource Districts. The FOCRC may be contacted for guidance and assistance in matters relating to cultural resources. Assistance by the FOCRC is under the technical supervision of the Cultural Resources Specialist.
