

MAINTENANCE OF CULTURAL RESOURCES INFORMATION

The Nebraska State Historical Society has provided information on the location of known sites based on the *Master Archeological Site File* as the data used to create the NRCS-Nebraska Field Office Cultural Resources Maps. NRCS employees carrying out the procedures for considering cultural resources in conservation assistance activities are authorized access to use the cultural resources maps. The information is protected from public disclosure under Nebraska State Laws, and by USDA and NRCS national policies.

Cultural resource information should be provided to the landowner and the current operator.

Do not disclose the map or information derived from it to the general public.

Field offices are to refer inquiries from the general public about the map or its contents to the Cultural Resources Coordinator/Specialist, or to the NRCS Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) officer at the State Office.

Paper copies of the map should not be included in the map section of Section I of the FOTG. The map should be kept in a publicly inconspicuous location, such as a map set or in an appropriately marked folder under Social Sciences 420. The maps can also be viewed in Section I / Maps / Nebraska Maps / Copies of Large Scale Maps / Cultural Resources Maps of the eFOTG.

Information about cultural resources is not public information and should not be released to the general public. Requests for such information can be handled as described above for the cultural resources map.
