OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE:

Conservation practice: Fence — applies to all livestock exclusion—fencing of intermittent and perennial streams, springs, ponds, woodlands, wildlife land, wetlands, and sensitive areas such as sinkholes, caves, and conservation buffers. This practice applies to cross—fencing used in rotational grazing systems as well as human and livestock exclusion from all waste management facilities. Regular fence inspection should be part of a continuous management program. Special attention should be given to fence inspection following severe storms. Fence maintenance and repair will be performed to ensure proper function and use. In some cases herbicide use (following instructions on label) will be necessary to control unwanted vegetation.
