DESIGN

Deliverables:

1. Design documentation that will demonstrate that the criteria in NRCS practice standard have been met and are compatible with other planned and applied practices.
 - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan
 - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
 - c. Compliance with NRCS national and state utility safety policy (NEM Part 503-Safety, Sections 503.00 through 503.22)
 - d. Practice standard criteria related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to:
 - i. Removal methods
 - ii. Safety issues
 - iii. Disposal methods
 - iv. Erosion and sediment controls
2. Written plans and specifications, including sketches and drawings, that adequately describe the requirements to install the practice and obtain necessary permits shall be provided to the client.
3. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and comply with applicable laws and regulations (NEM Subpart A, 505.03 (b) (2)).
4. Design modifications during installation as required.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables:

1. Pre Installation conference with client and contractor.
2. Verification that client has obtained require permits.
3. Staking and layout according to plans and specifications including applicable layout notes.
4. Installation inspection.
 - a. Actual materials methods used
 - b. Inspection records
4. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with client and original designer.
5. Advise client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations and NRCS policies during installation.
6. Certification that the installation process and materials meets design requirements (NEM Subpart A, 505.03 (c) (1)).

CHECK OUT

Deliverables:

1. As-Built documentation.
 - a. Extent of practice units applied
 - b. Drawings
 - c. Final quantities
2. Certification that the installation meets NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits.
3. Progress reporting.
