

**STATEMENT OF WORK
FUELBREAK (383)
WASHINGTON**

These deliverables apply to this individual practice. For other planned practice deliverables refer to those specific Statements of Work.

DESIGN

Deliverables:

1. Design documents that demonstrate criteria, in the NRCS practice standard, have been met and are compatible with planned and applied practices.
 - a. Practice purpose(s) as identified in the conservation plan
 - b. List of required permits to be obtained by the client
 - c. Practice standard criteria – related computations and analyses to develop plans and specifications including but not limited to;
 - i. Fuelbreak acres
 - ii. Crop species selection
 - iii. Tree/shrub spacing
 - iv. Pruning height
 - v. Slash treatment and disposal
 - vi. Grass/forb species seeded, seeding rate
2. Written plans and specifications including sketches and drawings shall be provided to the client that adequately describes the requirements to install the practice and obtain necessary permits.
3. Documentation of cultural resources evaluations and needed operation and maintenance.
4. Certification that the design meets practice standard criteria and comply with applicable laws and regulations.
5. Design modifications during installation as required.

INSTALLATION

Deliverables

1. Pre-application conference with the client.
2. Verification that the client has obtained the required permits.
3. Staking and layout according to plans and specifications including applicable layout notes.
4. Application guidance as needed.
5. Facilitate and implement required design modifications with the client and original designer.
6. Advise the client/NRCS on compliance issues with all federal, state, tribal, and local laws, regulations and NRCS policies during installation.
7. Certification that the application process and materials meet design and permit requirements.

CHECK OUT

Deliverables

1. Records of application/installation
 - a. Extent of practice units applied
 - b. Indications of actual materials used to implement the practice.
2. Certification that the application meets NRCS standards and specifications and is in compliance with permits.
3. Progress reporting.
