

**WYOMING – STATE SPECIES OF CONCERN
NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE
Field Office Technical Guide**

Title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section 650.22 directs that the NRCS consideration for species and their habitats, will include species designated by the State Wildlife Agencies as rare, endangered, threatened, or species of concern in the same manner as species listed by the US Fish and Wildlife as threatened, endangered, proposed, or candidate species. By General Manual policy Wyoming NRCS considers Wyoming designated **Species of Greatest Conservation Need (SGCN) Tier 1** as state species of concern.
